- 6. Why is it important that Ralph be the one to first enter the fort where they think the beast is?
- 7. Why is it that Jack joins Ralph as he explores the fort?

8. After they see there is no beast in the fort, the boys begin to play and have fun. Ralph chastises them for it and tries to get them to rebuild the fire and continue their search. Is he expecting too much of them? What might the results be of him demanding so much from them?
